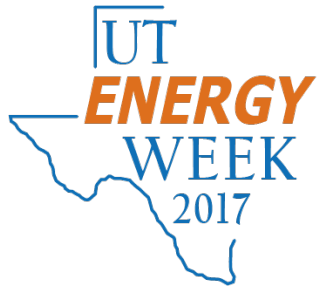
Why?

- To foster a positive image of UT with K-12 educators and the general public by organizing free-registration events on current energy issues.



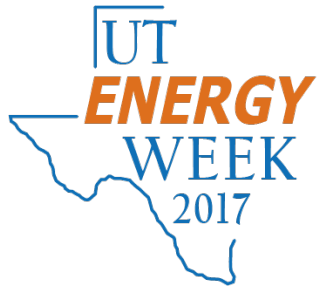

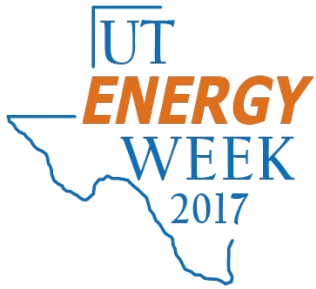
